HISTORY OF LÜDERITZ

HISTORY

- Originally inhabited by Nama People who knew the land as !Nami#nûs
- Adolf Lüderitz founded what is now known as Lüderitz in 1883
- Lüderitz is over 138 years old making it the oldest town in Namibia
- Luderitz is situated between diamond dunes, national park and the ocean, and it is absolutely beautiful

INTERESTING FACTS

- The biggest electricity power plant in Africa at the time, was built in Lüderitz
- The Deutsche Afrika Bank established its largest branch in Lüderitz and the building still serves as a bank to this day
- The first acquired X-ray machine , south of the Equator, was used in Lüderitz



PROFILE OF LÜDERITZ

- Lüderitz is a coastal town with abundance of natural resources
- Population of about 35,000
- The first diamonds in Namibia were found at Kolmanskop
- The Namibia's Fishing and Lobster Industry started operating from Lüderitz
- Rich in marine resources Oysters, Abalone, Capensis Hake, Lobster, Snoek, Angelfish, Monk, Kingklip, Swordfish, Tuna, etc

CHALLENGES

Overview

- Financial Constrains for Land delivery
- Topography of Lüderitz
- Proximity to the proclaimed Diamond Area & National Park
- Aging Electricity, Water, Sewerage & Road Infrastructure
- Lack of housing across all sectors especially pertaining to informal settlements, illegal squatter, Compounds and Single Quarters
- Some Fishing quotas allocated to Lüderitz waters are processed in Walvis Bay
- Higher cost of doing business due to location





ELECTRICAL INFRASTRUCTURE

To handle the projected growth of Luderitz, there are several issues that need immediate attention

- 2nd Nautilus North High Tension Power Line
- Upgrading of the 2nd Lagoon High Tension Power Line
- Agate Beach Ring Feeding Transmission Line
- Replacing all old switch gears and transformers
- Replacing all overhead cables with underground ones
- Upgrading all old underground cables
- 2nd NamPower feeder Power Line



ROADS

To handle the projected growth of Luderitz, there are several issues that need immediate attention

- Upgrading of Area 7 Road
- Upgrading of the Agate Beach Road
- Development of new roads for new Extensions
- Upgrading and/or maintenance of existing Road Infrastructure



SEWAGE

- Sewer pump stations are currently operating under tremendous stress and require regular maintenance
- The failure of these pump stations can lead to all sorts of challenges to health and environment due to toxic spillage
- A Retention Station can be used as an overflow which could completely eliminate spills
- A reinforced concrete reservoir upstream from Pump Station 5
- The current Effluent Treatment Plant is designed to handle 2000m3 of raw sewage currently the inflow stands a 1300m3. This equates to 65% use of the plant.



WATER

- Present demand is between 2500m3 and 3300m3 / day
- Namwater supply capacity is 200m3 / hour
- Bulk water Khoichab wellfield is able to supply 5500m3 / day
- Current bulk water supply at 140m3 / hour at about 3100m3 / day (Group A quality)
